  incorporated in the new contract: Performance bond, Insurance Policy, and NonCompliance accessed by Hull.
- This contract is up 15% more from last year.
- We had one other company bid and that company was \$88,000.00 more than Harter's.

### Agenda Item #10: Hidden Brook Subdivision Mailbox/Plowing Unresolved Issue

- Pete (road foreman) provided a picture of the mailbox for an example.
- The Builder had the mailbox installed before the road.
- \$50,000 wing on the plow would be taken out because the cement sticks up 4-5 inches.
- Town of Hull has not excepted the road as ours.
- Last year, we charged \$150.00 each time we plowed this subdivision.
  - Colin K. says he no longer owns the property.
  - o Developer won't work with us.
- Our Ordinance states:
  - o Dedicate
  - o If we hit the mailbox, we replace it.
    - **\$1700-3000**

- Dave (chairman) tried to talk with the Post Office, and they wouldn't get back to him.
- Mark's statements:
  - No obligation over the road because it wasn't dedicated.
  - o In order to dedicate their road, they have to comply and come to a board meeting and board approves.
  - Developer is responsible. (Barb agrees)
- Robin's statements:
  - o Can we mail/contact all the home owners?
    - Let them go after Jim the developer.
    - Send a letter to the developer as well.
    - Prices need to go up for the plowing.
    - The mailboxes are within our right-of-way doesn't meet our standards.
- Send a letter to all home owners stating we won't plow by the mailboxes; it is their responsibility to clear snow.
- Motion by Dave that he writes a letter from the Town to the home owners informing them that we will plow their road, but we will stay so many feet away from the mailbox. Send a letter, put on an Agenda and invite them all to a board meeting.

### Agenda Item #13: Town of Hull Board Approval to Publish 2023 Budget

- Updated highlights from Dave:
  - o Road Crew went from a 4-man crew down to a 3-man crew.
    - Supplement with part-time workers.
    - Total increase 0%.
  - o Sanitation
  - o Full-time Treasurer.
  - Operational deficit down to \$157,109.00.

- o Page 3 LOANS to purchase in 2023:
  - Chip seal, half-ton pick-up, Badger Books, Town Audit, phone system, commercial box scrapper, small John Deer, plow/harness/pump box for 2007.
  - Totaling: \$272,985.12
- Robin's Statements:
  - O Page 1 take \$10,000 out for training in the General Admin.
  - o Jan is in agreement.
  - o Barb doesn't want anyone to feel like no one is trained for their jobs.
  - o Dave- changed to \$5,000.00.
- Dave handed out the purchase agreement and debt service schedule.
  - o If we can keep the Debt Loan Payment = \$570,000.
    - Have an extra \$162,964 for our deficit in our Budget.
    - 2 Year Loan.
    - This would NOT increase taxes.
- Jim K. (citizen) Can you cross over Budgets?
  - Act 10 says it is against the law to have our debt load and Operation Budget together.
  - o It has to go to a referendum and be approved by the voters.
- We have gotten \$0.01 more in our Operational Budget in 12 years.
- Dave handed out the Town of Hull Levy Information Sheet.
  - o Debt Service can increase or lower.
  - Operational Budget cannot change.
- Motion by Mark to approve the \$272,985.12.
- 1st Mark 2<sup>nd</sup> Robin Motion carried unanimously roll call vote
