10) Discussion – Extra costs/services to complete North Second Dr. project.

Chair Pederson

Received info regarding North Second Drive and the need to cover some engineering, staking cost for the wetland area along the bridge on North Second for culverts needed

Supervisor Koshnick – thought this was all part of the project

Supervisor Wilz – this is for discussion. I think we should not take action on this for a couple of reasons

- 1) We chose this firm based off of a request for proposal not a bid
- 2) Chairman Holdridge along with Rick Stautz, Nate Check and a few citizens put together a really outstanding approach to solicit have asked for background to look at how we asked questions and to see if maybe these things weren't maybe included
- 3) Spoke briefly with Chairman Holdridge about this who stated he would have to look as cannot remember how this was done
- 4) Need to gather some of the information
- 5) We can reach out to Scott Whitsett and indicate we have received the information and let him know we will look in to as do not now have enough information to take action

Chair – we need to know more about how we went about getting the original agreement to do the engineering and whether this was included in the request that was accepted.

Supervisor Wilz – Nate Check was a big help with this. He does a lot of these agreement so maybe he can be helpful.

Chair – We need to have Scott Whitsett here too when we make a decision on it.

Supervisor Way – Please explain what Scott means in the last paragraph about the \$25,000. Is that a total \$25,000 savings to Hull? The bridge/culvert aid project. Is he suggesting that is going to help them balance it out?

Supervisor Wilz – He is saying two things there

- 1) He is saying we are under budget so we reached out to Nate Check to see if that had anything to do with the culvert aid that is available through the county
- 2) I think he is also reminding us that he is \$25,000 under budget and he is doing a great job
 - This is not an invoice. It is a reach out to us that we have some issues that I want you to be aware of

Motion Supervisor Wilz, <u>table discussion on North Second Drive until Chair Holdridge</u> <u>is back, and we have a change to analyze how we came to this point.</u> Second by Supervisor Koshnick. Motion carried by voice vote.

Chair Pederson will reach out to Scott of Jewell.

11) Discussion – DNR permit application for wetland fill disturbance for North Second Dr. project

Chair Pederson – the wetland comes to almost ½ acre that will be disturbed.

We need to publish a Class 1 notice

Clerk Wolle – the notice will be published in the Stevens Point Journal on March 13, 2019. The DNR put the notice on their website last week.

12) Discussion about the Kyle Kluck property

Chair Pederson – this is something that is fluid at this point. We have reached out to the city and the city has agreed to talk with Hull about the whole issue relating to the Kyle Kluck property.

Supervisor Wilz – the meeting with the city is after the Special Town Meeting to be held on March 18, 2019.

Chair Pederson – can ignore vote of citizens

Supervisor Wilz – have to vote on subject matter

Treasurer Kruziki – will there be written communication to citizens? We are aware, but citizens to come in to a Special Town meeting, how much are they aware of the details.

Supervisor Wilz – had many meetings prior to Special Town meeting relating to the building. Citizens knew what was happening. Kyle Kluck property not the same.

Supervisor Way – Everybody not receiving all of the information (getting wrong information). Most people concerned about annexation. City does not want to annex.

Chair Pederson – is it appropriate to invite city officials to the meeting?

Supervisor Wilz - it does not mean annexation will not happen in the future. We are concerned about annexation.

Chair Pederson – City wants to protect Well #11.

Supervisor Way – not so much nitrates as it is medications being flushed.

Supervisor Wilz – if Hull owns the property we control – that is not necessarily true.

Mike Splinter – have to know what you can or cannot do

Supervisor Wilz – the unknowns have to be known.
