- > Requesting to view operation of new tractor (Minn)
- Supervisors John Koshnick and Dave Pederson questions use vs needs, Fluid in tires? Flail mower needed?
- Dave Wilz confirms cab is a necessity, long term use, needs to be able to mow grass, Brush cutting

- ➤ Pete states to add Comfort Cab to bid \$187,138 with Rotary head, Forestry Head is \$1000.00 cheaper
- ➤ Motion by John Koshnick to purchase tractor with Air Ride cab, 2nd by Dave Wilz. Attachments (Mower Head) at a later date.

- > This is a Board decision
- No enforcement, No County Ordinance to enforce
- ➤ Barb Brilowski-Deputy Clerk explains issues with compliance, expectations of Ordinance, violating is happening, Pete confirms
- Suggestion of follow through from builders but responsibility is on hauler
- Noon closing on Fridays an option?
- Is there tracking of Road permits? Done daily not hourly.
- Heaviest permit day? Depends on what's happening in Hull
- > Supervisor John Koshnick suggests letter be sent to truckers
