02) Vouchers

Motion Supervisor Pederson, <u>approve payment of vouchers presented</u>. Second by Supervisor Wilz. Motion carried by voice vote.

03) Appointment of Hull Road Committee

Motion Supervisor Wilz, <u>approve appointment to the Hull Road Committee: John Holdridge, John Koshnick, Larry Barikmo, Dan Dieterich, Brett Boehnlein Jim Kalpinski, Madelin Putz, Jim Pozniak and Mary Olson</u>. Second by Supervisor Way. Motion carried by voice vote.

04) Salary for elected clerk and elected treasurer for the 2019-2020 term

Motion Supervisor Wilz, <u>accept action taken in 2016 giving the board action to set salaries for elected clerk and elected treasurer - approve 2.25% increase in wages for elected clerk and elected treasurer beginning April 2019 and CPI index increase beginning April 2020.</u> Second by Supervisor Pederson. Hull Adopt-A-Road Program

The purpose of the Hull Adopt-A-Road Program is to engage Hull citizens, households and public or private improvement groups to pick up trash twice annually along Hull roads. Their involvement to keep Hull roadways clean represents a high level of citizen commitment to the Town of Hull civil life.

The Hull Town Board approves the following guidelines for Hull Adopt-A-Road Program:

- 1. Citizen, households and groups complete an application to establish an Adopt-A-Road program in their neighborhood.
- 2. Citizen, household or group designates a leader or contact person with address, e-mail and phone number.
 - 3. Three-year commitment required from applicant(s).
- 4. Only non-profit or not-for-profit groups are eligible to participate. Groups may include families, churches and public service improvement groups.
- 5. Hull provides a street sign with name suggested by group to designate the road for trash pickup.
 - 6. Hull provides bags, gloves, vests and safety signs. Hull Road Crew will pick up filled trash bags.
- 7. Group provides members and agrees to do roadside pickup twice annually spring and fall and to use Hull provided safety flags and vests during roadside pickup.

- 8. Most routes would be approximately two miles but some may be longer or shorter. All routes would be mutually agreed upon between the applicant and the Town of Hull.
 - 9. Roads in Adopt-A-Road program should be through roads and not dead-end roads.
- 10. Annually, Hull official will contact Adopt-A-Road participant for input and feedback on proper implementation of safety concerns.

Town of Hull Board Policy Protocol for Plowing Hull Roads

All Town of Hull roads are plowed if there is one (1) inch or more of snow. If there is less than one (1) inch of snow, the intersections, curves and hills are sanded. All main roads are plowed if there is less than one (1) inch of snow. These roads include:

Brilowski Road North Reserve (south end) Torun Road Casimir Road (up to church) North Second Drive Wilshire Drive

Golla Road Old Highway 18 Wojcik Memorial Drive

Jordan Road Old Wausau Road **Granite Ridge Rd. N. north to Sawmill**Sawmill Road

These roads get salt/sand in entirety including the intersections which get salt/sand plus 100-200 feet prior to the intersection. In the subdivisions, it is preferred to plow the main outlet and sand so there is not a buildup of ice. The remaining is sanded at intersections.

If there is an ice storm, the grader is used to cut ice on the main roads only. Main roads are salted with an 8-1 mixture of sand to salt. Use of straight (100%) salt on Hull roads will be documented with road name and application date and reported in a timely manner to Hull's chairperson.

Special Circumstances

Turf "damage" – Removing snow from Town road surfaces requires snow be moved to the roadside right-of-way. Heavy snowfalls accumulating in the Town right-of-way requires the use of the snowplow's nine-foot (9') wing to move snow back from the driving surface. **The wing effective plowing distance is 3 to 6 feet beyond the 11 to 12-foot main plow.** The snowplow wing may peel the turf if the ground is soft and/or throw gravel from the shoulder off the road with snow. Such "damage" often appears after plowing.

Mailbox "damage" - A Town snowplow may knock over or break off a mailbox.

Damage Resolution

Turf – The Town Board establishes the right of the Town snowplows to use the first nine (9) feet from the edge of the paved surface for snow storage. Any perceived "damage" within those nine (9) feet will be the responsibility of the adjacent landowner to correct. The Town will take responsibility for repairing lawn damage caused by the snowplow beyond the nine (9) feet from the road surface. The homeowner is responsible for notifying the Town of such damage. The Town will repair the damage when the work can be scheduled.

Mailbox – The Town will repair and/or replace a mailbox damaged or broken off by a snowplow wing. If replacement is needed, a comparable box and/or post will be provided by the Town. Hull costs not to exceed \$75. It is the responsibility of the homeowner to notify the Town of such damage within 3 days. However, homeowners who are away from Hull on vacation, gone during the winter months or not available in the 3-day window, shall notify Hull officials when they return and discover mailbox damage. The Town will repair/replace the mailbox when the repair/replacement can be scheduled.

This policy is a consolidation of two previous polices: <u>Protocol for Plowing Hull Roads</u>, and draft <u>Policy on</u> Snowplowing of Subdivisions and right-of-way.

BRUSH PICKUP – CURBSIDE POLICY

For a number of years, the Town of Hull has picked up curbside brush piles during the annual spring cleanup.

The following procedures apply:

- 1. The maximum dimension of the brush pile cannot exceed 12'Lx12'Wx6'H. Brush piles larger will not be picked up by the Hull road crew (see #4 below).
- 2. The following additional requirements apply:
 - a. Only one pile per land parcel
 - b. Branches must be piled in one direction with butt end toward the road
 - c. Branches must be placed at least 15 feet from mailbox, signs or trees
 - d. Branches can be <u>no</u> longer than 12 feet in length
 - e. Branches can be no wider than 6 inches in diameter
 - f. No scrap lumber or pallets will be picked up
- 3. Other provisions of policy:
 - a. No tree stumps or tree roots will be in the pile. The pile will not be picked up if tree stumps or roots are present
 - b. Branches cut for resale as pulp will not be picked up
- 4. Inspection of pile:
 - a. Brush piles will be inspected prior to pick-up. Those exceeding dimensions will be flagged by the Town of Hull to notify resident of policy violation. Those branch piles will not be picked up

Exception to this policy requires approval by Hull Board of Supervisors.
