

ORDINANCE #15-0112
SNOW and ICE REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALK

- (1) Removal from Sidewalks. The owner, occupant, or person in charge of any building fronting upon any street, and the owner or person in charge of an unoccupied dwelling or lot fronting as aforesaid, shall clean the sidewalk in front of such building, or unoccupied lot or dwelling, of snow and ice from sidewalk and cause same to be kept clear of snow and ice, provided that when ice has formed on any sidewalk that is cannot be removed, the persons herein referred to shall keep the same sprinkled with ashes, sawdust, or sand. In the event of a snow storm accumulated snow shall be removed from the abutting sidewalk by the owner or occupant of any premises within twenty-four hours after the snow ceases to fall.
- (2) Town May Remove and Place on Tax Roll. Whenever the owner or occupant of any lot or premises shall neglect or fail to remove the snow or ice in front of the same for twenty-four hours, the Town of Hull shall cause such snow to be removed, provided that when ice has so formed on any sidewalk that it cannot be removed, the same shall be sprinkled with sand, and when completed, the Town Clerk shall prepare a bill of cost thereof, describing the real estate in front of which the work is done; if the cost of removal is not paid, it shall be placed in the next tax roll by the clerk in a separate column to be called "SNOW REMOVAL" and the same shall be collected in the like manner as other taxes are collected.
- (3) The unit of government (Federal, state, County, City Village, Town) responsible for or controlling the right-of-way in whose jurisdiction the sidewalk is located shall be responsible for sidewalk maintenance including but not limited to snow removal and removal or treatment of ice.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.
